## Minutes of the Meeting in the Chamber of the Chief Secretary held on 27th July 2016

The meeting commenced at 12.30 P.M with Shri.S.M Vijayanand IAS. Chief Secretary to Government of Kerala in the chair. The following officers were present.

The Secretary, Cultural Affairs Department explained that the D partment of Archaeology has only one post of Conservation Engineer in the grade of Assistant Engineer and Conservation Engineer who was working on deputation for the last nine years has been reverted to his parent department on 08 07/2016, The post of Conservation Engineer is lying vacant now.

Hence, the conservation works are at a standstill now. The department has 179 protected monuments and also has to conserve heritage buildings and museums.

The Department require three Assistant Engineers for Malabar, Kochi and Travancore zones and an Assistant Executive Engineer for supervision at the Directorate level.

The Chief Secretary stressed the point that, conservation works at archaeological monuments should be executed by engineers having expertise in conservation techniques. The Secretary, Cultural Affairs Department informed that arrangements could be made to organise training with the support of the Archaeological Survey of India, if a panel of five engineers each could be provided by PWD/Irrigation/LSGD.

The Chief Secretary suggested that Water Resources Department could provide adequate engineers for Archaeology Department as they have sufficent member of Engineers.

The following decisions were taken after the discussions:

1. Water Resources Department would take steps to provide the service of an Assistant Engineer from their department on deputation to Archaeology Department. They will also provide two Assistant Engineers and one Enigneer not below the rank of Assistant Executive Engineer of working arrangement to Archaeology department.

2. Water Resources, PWD and LSGD would provide a panel of Assistant Engineers/Assistant Executive lingineers and Archaeology department would arrange a training for them on conservation with the support of ASI so that their service could be made use of in works under Archaeology Department.
